

AUSTRALIAN WEIGHTLIFTING FEDERATION INC COACH DEVELOPMENT ADVISORY GROUP (CDAG)

Terms of Reference

Role

The AWF Coach Development Advisory Group (CDAG) will play a key role in supporting and contributing to the ongoing education, development and implementation of the AWF's coach development program as it relates to the AWF's strategic plan.

The CDAG will:

- Advise on the direction of coaching development within Australia and ensure the objectives of the AWF's strategic plan are met;
- Provide opportunities and expertise to states and territories in the delivery of Coaching Development.
- Monitor, support and evaluate the AWF's coach Training Programs and other coach development initiatives throughout all States and Territories;
- Identify areas of co-operation and collaboration among key stakeholders;
- Develop recommendations on Coach Development to the AWF Executive Board as required.
- Commission, author and/or promulgate any guidelines, protocols or instructions it considers necessary for the AWF to achieve its overall objectives.
- Develop Budgets concerning coach education and development.

Membership

The AWF CDAG is appointed by the AWF Executive Board.

The AWF CDAG may elect to co-opt members from other organisations should it be deemed necessary.

Relationship to the AWF Executive Board

The AWF CDAG will have the capacity to submit information, recommendations, issues and concerns that require the attention of the AWF Executive Board for discussion and/or action.

Meeting Guidelines

Meetings of the AWF CDAG will meet four times minimum within the twelve-month period from 20 July 2005 and from then on as required. (Note: face-to-face meetings may not always be economically viable. Teleconferences may be the only viable alternative).

Lyn Jones will act as the Chair of the AWF CDAG.

Reaccreditation

The AWF Executive Board has made a decision to re-accredit former current level coaches to the new Club level for the next two-years, all former current Level 2 coaches to the new State level for the next two-years and all former Level 3 coaches to the new National level for the next four-years.
